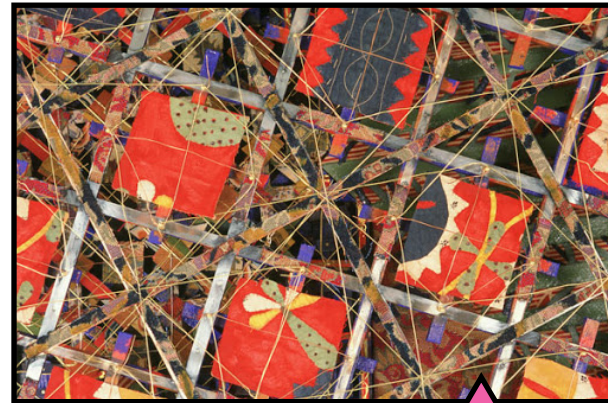

'Slow Turning' by Michael Brennand Wood

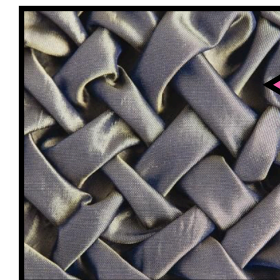
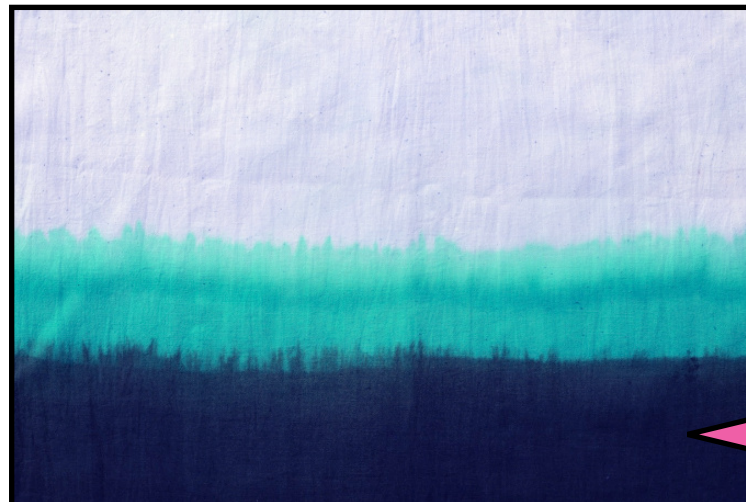
