Vocabulary	
construction	(in textiles) layering, stitching, weaving, pleating, plaiting, tying and knotting
deconstruction	(in textiles) cutting, tearing, hole-punching, thread removing, unpicking
layering	arranging in layers (on top of or across one another)
assembling	arranging and putting together
joining	to link or connect, perhaps by sewing
relief	a technique which can make the artwork seem 3D or as if it is coming out of itself - manipulating textures


