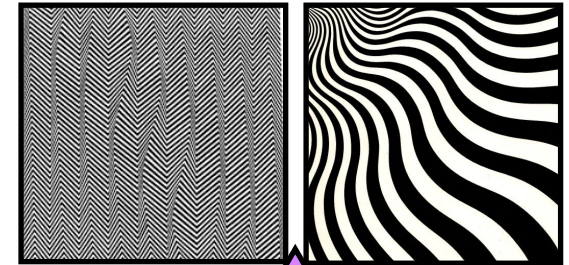


Vocabulary

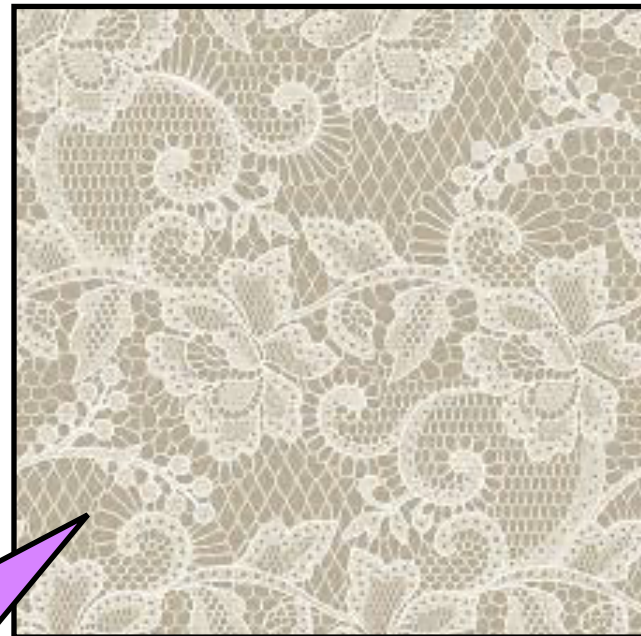
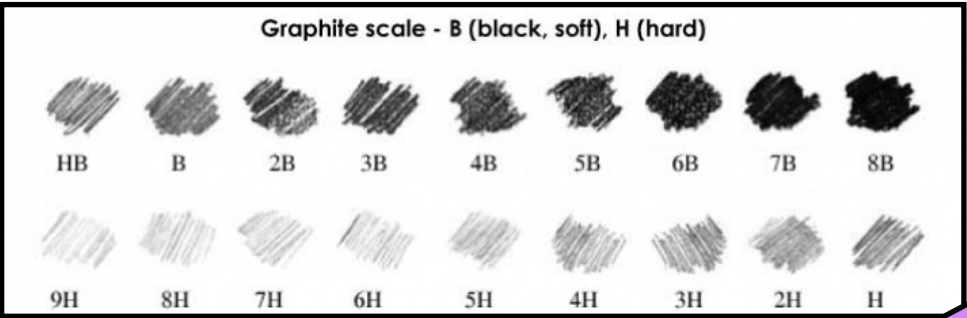
marks	the word used to describe different lines, patterns and textures in art
line	can be curved or straight and vary in width or texture
proportion	to do with ratio and size - the size of something in relation to something else
direction	direction brings clarity and definition to our artwork
composing	creating
linear	using lines and outlines
concentric	Using circles, arcs or other shapes which share the same centre
tone	Chiaroscuro - refers to the use of light and dark in an artwork
control	to decide how your artwork should look before starting it and knowing which materials or medium to use



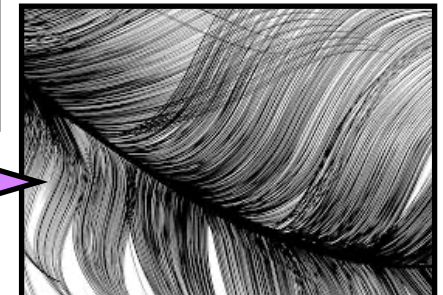
(a painting) Concentric Circles by Wassily Kandinsky
