maquette	a scaled-down preliminary model (in sculpture or architecture)
pinching	gripping (something) between your finger and thumb
pendant	a piece of jewellery that hangs from a chain worn around the neck
decoration	the process or art of decorating something; embellishing
modification	the act of modifying, adapting, improving or adjusting something
series	a set or sequence (of TV programmes, films, books, artworks)
cultures	the ideas, customs and behaviours of a particular people or society

Celtic and Viking Pendants

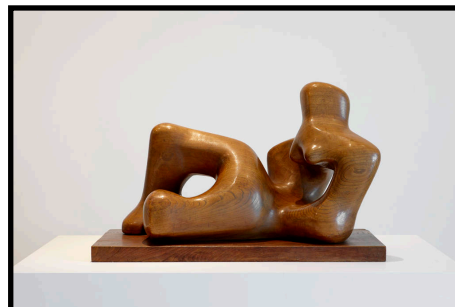


We will be working with clay to design our own pendants.



Henry Moore is a British artist known for his semi-abstract monumental bronze sculptures which are located all around the world as public works of art.

As starting points for his sculptures, Moore made small clay maquettes.



We are going to be looking at masks from different cultures and making our own. This type of work is called a 'response' and must be based on your own research and source material.

We will use brown paper to mould our masks over balloons and then paint and modify once they are dry.
